


CIDER MILL COLOUR TOUR


Dispite threatening weather we had a pretty good turnout.

MEMBER OF THE MONTH




VEHICLE: 1966 GT 350 Shelby.



A MAN CALLED GARROLL STORY CARROLL CARROLL



Carroll Shelby's return to the U.S. automotive scene is straight out of a John Wayne western.

The legendary, distinguished, toughtalking, he-does-what-he-says-he's-going-to-do tall man in a Stetson is called out of retirement to bring life to the valley once again.

Shelby fits the description perfectly. Only, this time the setting is the U.S. automotive market, and instead of a six-gun, his weapon will be a 2.2-liter four-cylinder engine built by the Chrysler Corporation.

When word hit the auto industry that Shelby was teaming up with his old friend, Chrysler Chairman Lee Iacocca, to help develop some special Dodge Charger 2.2s and return Chrysler to the performance arena; observers recalled the exciting days of the early '60s when performance was king and earshattering V-8s were the name of the game.

Shelby was there, all right, running Ford Motor Co.'s racing program and ultimately producing 900 Cobras that still command serious money when sold—if you can find one.

Carroll came out of Leesburg in East Texas in the early '50s and began drivin' them gas eaters that raised dust, hopes and hackles.

He drove them better than most and wound up as a driver for the Aston Martin team before forming Carroll Shelby Sports Cars in Dallas. After an initial misadventure with General Motors, Shelby got together with Ford in 1961 to get some 260cubic-inch V-8 engines for his new American sports car, the Cobra.

The Cobra took off like it had mistakenly entered a mongoose convention and started winning road races. Speeds went up as engines got bigger, and the Cobra went to a 289-cubic-inch V-8, then to 427s and even a 428.

While Cobras were coiling up in winner's circles, Shelby got involved with Ford's factory racing effort. Like everything else, he went all out to do it right and led the Ford factory team to a 1-2-3- finish at the legendary 24-hour Le Mans Endurance Race in France. That startled the international set!

Before long the auto industry found itself floundering in alphabet soup as it tried to deal with government regulations and things like EPA, CAFE and MPG.

Those letters spelled the initial demise of performance to Shelby who resigned himself to other things like flying his plane—he's a former Air Force pilot—founding companies to make aftermarket parts and food mixes, and organizing chili-cooking contests.

Now headquartered in California (because he finds Texas cold in the winter), Shelby hunts, reads and flies for leisure.

But he never gets too far away from his first love, cars. And he likes what Chrysler Corporation is doing. He particularly likes the 2.2-liter four-cylinder engine designed and built by Chrysler.

As Shelby told George Levy in a recent article in *Auto Week*, "From what I've seen at Chrysler, there's some criteria laid down by Iacocca that, yes, they're going to have to go four-cylinder and they're going to have to meet these government regulations; but they're going to have cars that are ahead of their counterparts in Detroit and the imports, size for size, on the engines. They have to have performance... Now that little two-two (2.2-liter) that Chrysler has, is one heck of an engine.

"It's a whole new kind of muscle car," Shelby said recently, "one that makes sense for the 1980s."

Very soon, wheels will be turning on some distinctive Dodge Charger 2.2s that bear the distinctive Shelby touch. Chrysler's the only one of the Big Three he hasn't tuned an engine for. We're ready and we only go First Class. That's Shelby.
