TECHNICAL TIPS

'66 Strip Info

Several members have asked for the formula and application of the '66 GT-350 (or GT-350H) gold paint LeMans stripes. Here it is:

This material was supplied by Marv Nelly. Marv owns a Ford dealership in Ottsville, Pa., and currently owns a 1966 GT-350H and a '65 GT-350.

Marv bought his Hertz Shelby in '66 when Hertz put the car up for sale and has restored it to better than new condition.

Following is his recommended procedure for applying the acrylic Gold Iridescent stripes to a GT-350H or GT-350.

1. Prepare surface as follows:
 - a. Clean bare metal with metal conditioner or metal prep
 - b. Clean original paint area with wax remover (R-M #900 Pre-Kleene)
 - c. Featheredge all painted area with fine sandpaper
 - d. Apply Universal (acrylic/lacquer) Primer Surfacer, reduced with $1\frac{1}{4}$ parts good lacquer thinner to 1 part Primer Surfacer, allowing each coat to flash dry
 - e. Apply glazing putty if necessary
 - f. Finish sand with 400 grit wet sandpaper
2. Apply Gold Acrylic
 - a. Mix 2 oz of Crescent Bronze Powder (Extra Brilliant Pale Gold #251) with each quart R-M 827 clear acrylic

b. Strain and reduce with R-M PMT-88 Universal Lacquer/Acrylic Thinner ($1\frac{1}{2}$ to 1)

c. Spray a thin mist coat until coverage is accomplished — THEN STOP

3. R-M #827 Clear Acrylic Finish Coats

a. Reduce R-M 827 Clear Acrylic $1\frac{1}{4}$ parts thinner with 1 part 827 clear

b. Apply four coats, allowing each coat to flash dry

4. Allow 15 hours to air dry or 30 minutes at 170° force dry

Then polish with FINE polishing compound if desired.

NOTE: Gloss may be sufficient without extra polishing.

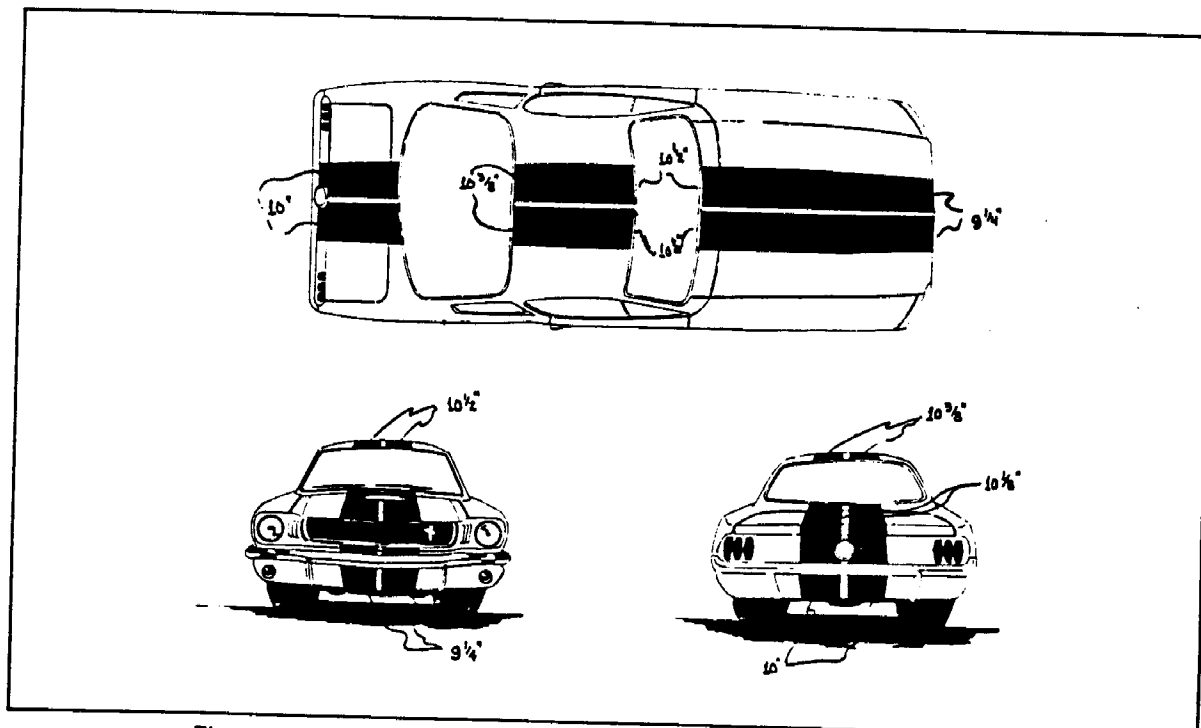

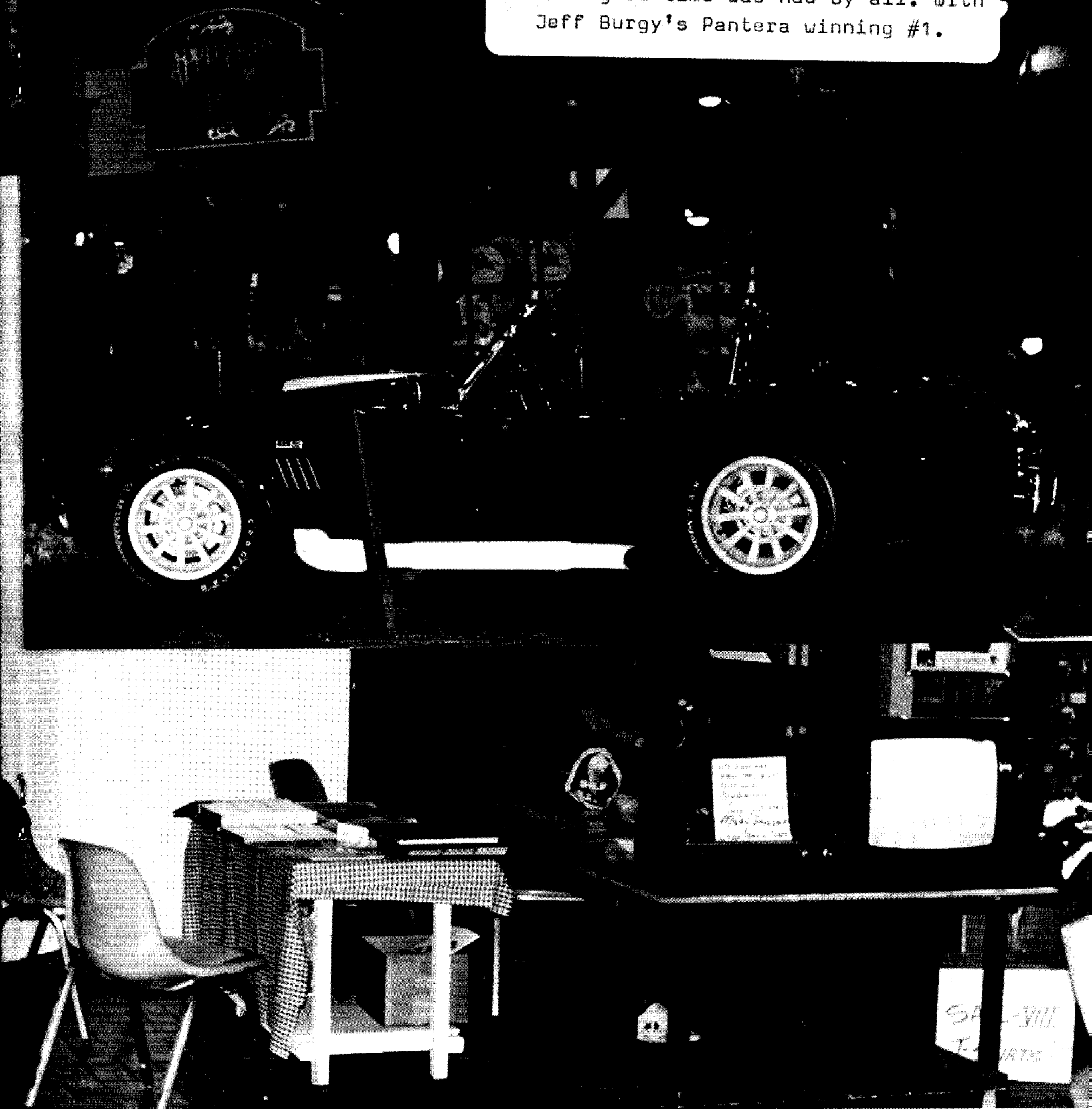

MEETING MINUTES

November 3, 1983

Meeting called to order at 7:55 pm

Item 1 -Minutes of October meeting were read to members.

Item 2 -Membership Report -Craig Shefferly-none.

Item 3 -October Board Meeting-Tom Greene-Officers and Board members duties were defined and a list of these will be published in the newsletter.

Club insurance-J.C. Taylor was suggested as a possible source who handles the Mustang Owners Club. Hemmings Motor News was recommended as publishing a monthly ad for this company. They charge approximately \$450 a year.

Next board meeting will be Wednesday November 7, 1983 at 7:30 pm place-Mama mias.

Item 4 -Treasurer's Report-Lee Swonder-June Balance-\$532.00-Currently \$834.43

Item 5&6 -Editor's Report & National News-John Guyer-No newsletter. Some members and their cars were immortalized on the cover of #42 of The Shelby American.

Item 7 -Operating Director's Report-Tom Greene-Tom passed around results of the Super Ford Show.

Show & Go IX is planning to join the ranks with the Mustang Club of Michigan in 1984. Planned events are to have dragstrip Saturday; car show Sunday; autocross Monday; Memorial weekend. The autocross will be held at the north end of the Ford test track in Livonia on a 9/10 mile banked oval.

The Mustang Club usually draws about 100 cars and the MCR also draws about 100 cars. Discussion was held as to location of Show & Go IX. The majority of the members wished to keep it in Dearborn. Advertising would appear in both the national magazine and the newsletter.

A concours would be run on a test basis at this year's event. A committee would have to be formed between the two clubs. They would organize the event and would also have the responsibility of picking and training judges.

The question was brought up as to whether revenue from the event would be divided equally between the clubs. A motion was made to

have the Mustang Club join with the Motor City Region on Show & Go IX in 1984. The combination of the two clubs would not hinder the

financial aspect of making a profit. The question was brought up whether the AAA parking lot was feasibly adequate to handle a show of this size. The motion was seconded and a majority vote was taken approving the merger. The planning would be vigorously pursued before the next monthly meeting.

Would anyone be interested in inviting the Shelby Chargers club to Show & Go IX? They would produce additional revenue at the gate. In the past years the traditional Show and Go has been all Ford powered. A motion was made, seconded and unanimously voted for in favor of not inviting the Shelby Chargers to this year's events over Memorial day weekend.

Dale Rabe asked members if they would be interested in participating in a national Ford display of Mustangs possibly at the Pontiac Silverdome in the near future? It would be an involvement of all Mustang clubs across the nation.

Autorama -planning will be discussed tonight and at the next board meeting. One of the main problems seems to be getting out of the show after it is over. Rick Jones advised that you have to be down early to set up and have only minimal construction on your display. Would there be any objection to handing out club membership applications? How much club interest would there be in participating in Autorama? About four to six members locally showed interest.

Item 8 -Social Report-Diane Burgy-Substitute Tom Greene-many thanks to the members who attended the Frankenmuth tour.(a good time had by all-ed.) The Christmas party was cancelled due to a lack of interest. The Mustang Club is having their Christmas party December 16th at Cameron Hall on Telegraph Road south of Van Born. See Don or Ruby Gillespie for more information. A motion was made to make a financial donation to the children's home and supply some T-shirts to the kids. The motion was seconded and unanimously voted for everyone to make a donation.

Item 9 -License plate fee report-John Kachigian-the Secretary of State office reports that the new license plate fees will affect 1980 and newer. Members cars are not affected at all. Weight will be the determining factor for cars up until 1980. Value of the car after 1980. John reported going to an Arlington Hts., Illinois meet recently and 85% of the show being GM oriented. John only saw a 15% Ford turnout but ended up buying a Mustang Indy Pace Car at the event. Rick Jones commented that the Hershey, Pa. show is now the largest with the Carlyle, Pa. show more Ford oriented.

Item 10 -Tech Librarian-Grant Martin-none-Tom Greene donated a Ford Hi-performance engine catalog to the library.

Item 11 -Tech Info Exchange-part numbers and information on

high torque windings for Ford starters were recently published in several major publications. Rick Jones just purchased Webers for his Shelby. Greg Koss can get Weber parts for interested members.

Item 12 -Swap & Sell-68 Mustang Fastback quarter panel for sale-Mustang Club. 64-68 Mustang convertible top for sale by guess who. 79 Mustang front/rear seats, stereo,tail lights, and rear panel.-Lee Swonder. Would members be interested in a guest speaker?

MCR Monthly Membership Meeting-December 1st, 1983

Meeting called to order at 7:30 pm.

Bob Varcoe, a new member was introduced to fellow members in attendance.

Item 1 -Membership Report-Craig Shefferly-We have one new member and 145 current members on our roster. Starting January 1st annual dues of \$12.50 will be collected for membership until January 1st of 1985. Any member joining in October or later of 1983 will have their dues pro-rated for the next year at \$1.00 per month and \$1.50 for December.

Item 2 -Editors Report/National News-John Guyer-Tom Greene said that the newsletter was at the printers. Any articles should be sent to John Guyer. We are in need of articles for future newsletters. A letter from the national club was passed around concerning position on the Shelby Chargers.

Item 3 -Operating Director's Report-Tom Greene-Tom advised that incorporation papers will be finalized and mailed out as soon as possible.

Autorama-a dead issue; no club participation this year due to a lack of interest.

Swap Meet-A MCR swap meet will be held Sunday January 29th at Paul Rebmann's shop. Tom asked for volunteers for a swap meet director? Bob and Dolores Craig will organize the swap meet with lots

of help from the club members. They volunteered their phone number as an information contact to be published in the newspaper and flyers.

Dale Rabe, publicity director, will handle all advertising of the event. Jeff Burgy will draw up an 8 1/2 X 11" flyer to be distributed. Show & Go IX-An agreement has been made with the Mustang Club of Southeastern Michigan to put on the Show & Go IX as a joint effort. The gate split would be 75% to MCR and 25% to the Mustang club. The swap meet would be split on a 50-50 basis. All members voted unanimously in favor of this agreement.

Jeff Burgy, Mark Corich, and Rick Jones have been chosen to coordinate the whole show. A chair person will be needed for the show, swap meet, judging, and speed events. A representative of each club would be preferred to handle each specific event to make all policies fair. A meeting of all interested participants would be held at Rick Jones' house Tuesday December 15th at 7:30 pm. Contact Rick for directions to his house.

The next MCR board meeting will be held Thursday December 8th and the next Mustang club meeting will be Tuesday December 13th. National publications are now being contacted by the Mustang club for advertising of the event. A standardized form for entry to the event is being used with minor alterations to include the participation of the Mustang club.

Local regions (Ohio/Indiana) will be major contributors to Show & Go IX with the national convention being held on the west coast in 84. The autocross event to be held in Livonia has not been held at the Ford test track since 1972. There have been problems sifting thru the bureaucracy and red tape to get permission to use the track.

A 1984 tentative calendar of events was passed around by Tom Greene. The 1984 calendar was still in the process of being made. 13 pictures are needed and should be sent to John Guyer. Dale Rabe will handle the printing. The club hopes to have it out by February.

Next month's meeting will feature one possibly two movies to be loaned to us by the Mustang club.

An annual membership letter will be coming out shortly advising of dues owed by each member of \$12.50 for the 1984 calendar year.

Item 4 -Social Report-Diane Burgy-Money will be given to the children's home by the MCR. We would like a donation of at least \$5.00 per member if possible or really what ever you can give. The club collected \$65.00 by passing around the hat to the attending members.

Mark Bednarek-President of the Mustang club said they were excited about participating in the upcoming Show & Go IX. He brought along some Mustang newsletters for interested members. December 16th is the date of the Mustang club annual Christmas party. It will be held at Carermon Hall on Telegraph just south of Van Born. Admission price is \$11.50 per person which includes entertainment, dinner and a complimentary drink for the first 130 buying tickets. 110 tickets have been sold so the Mustang club needs confirmation tonight and payment by Monday.

Item 5 -Technical Librarian-Grant Martin-none.

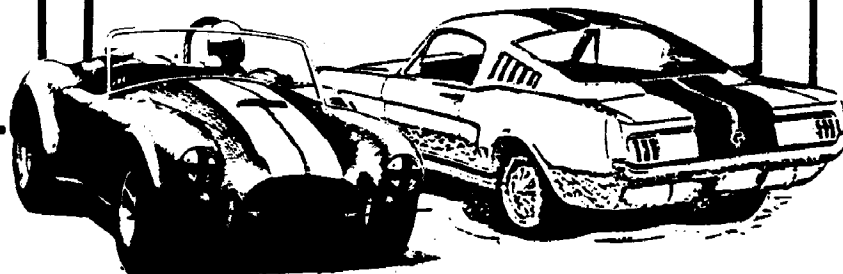

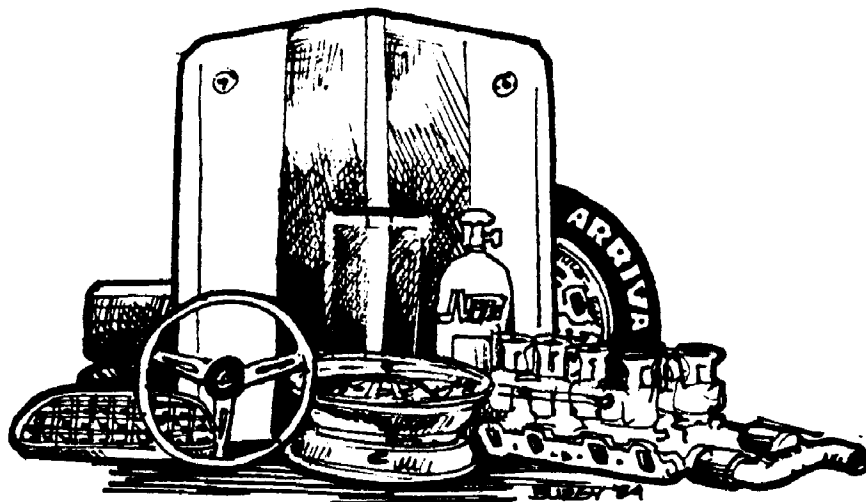

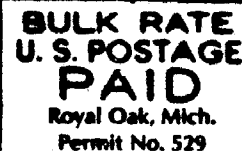
