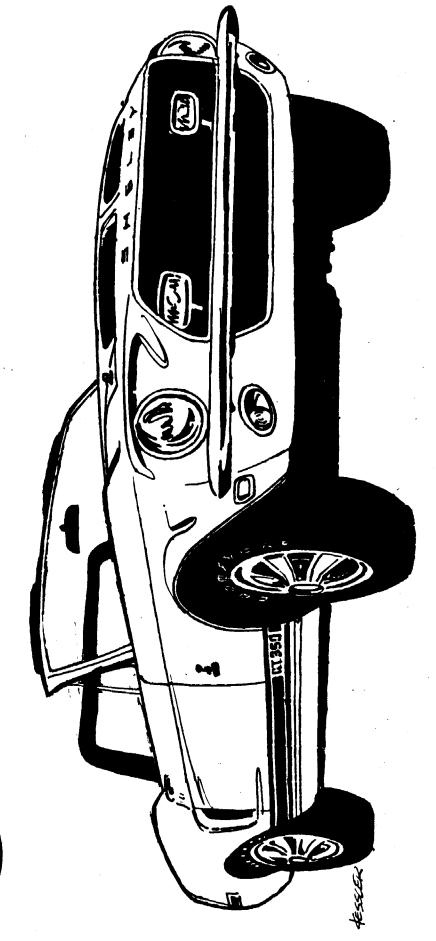
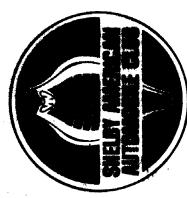

Mustang club is having a colour tour Sunday, October 14th. They are also having a Christmas party. No date is set as yet. \$25-30 per couple.

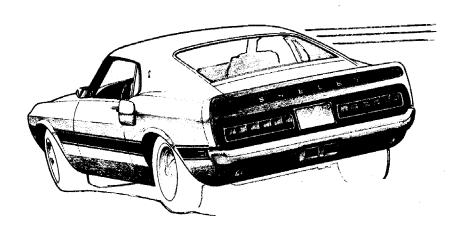

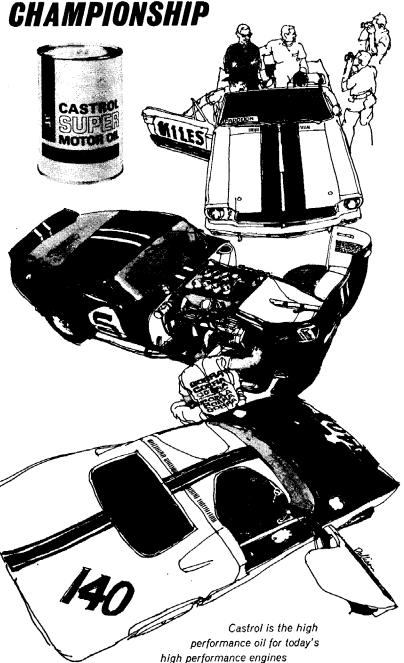

EDITORIAL

A recent issue of Sports Car
Graphic had a cover story on the 'Fastest
American Sports Car Ever!'. They gave away the
answer on the cover with a picture of two Cobras
and a statement "Shelby's Cobra still the
undisputed King of the Street".

Car Review Magazine gave a listing of the 50 Fastest Muscle Cars. Immediately going over the chart produced only three cars from Shelby. The 427 Cobra at #1, a GT-350S at #21 and a 289 Cobra at #23. The Cobra being fastest was no suprise and the 289 would be in there somewhere. What's a GT-350S? Where's the other Shelby's at? There are unrestored cars that will still run faster than the 12.20 to 14.40 second spread listed. Other magazines of recent years show Shelby cars running faster than that. So what's the story. Well maybe the text would shed some light on these and other questions.

The GT-350S turns out to be a Shelby with a Paxton blower on it. "S" for supercharged no doubt.

It seems that the main sources of the article were four magazines: Car & Driver, Motor Trend, Road Test and Car Life.

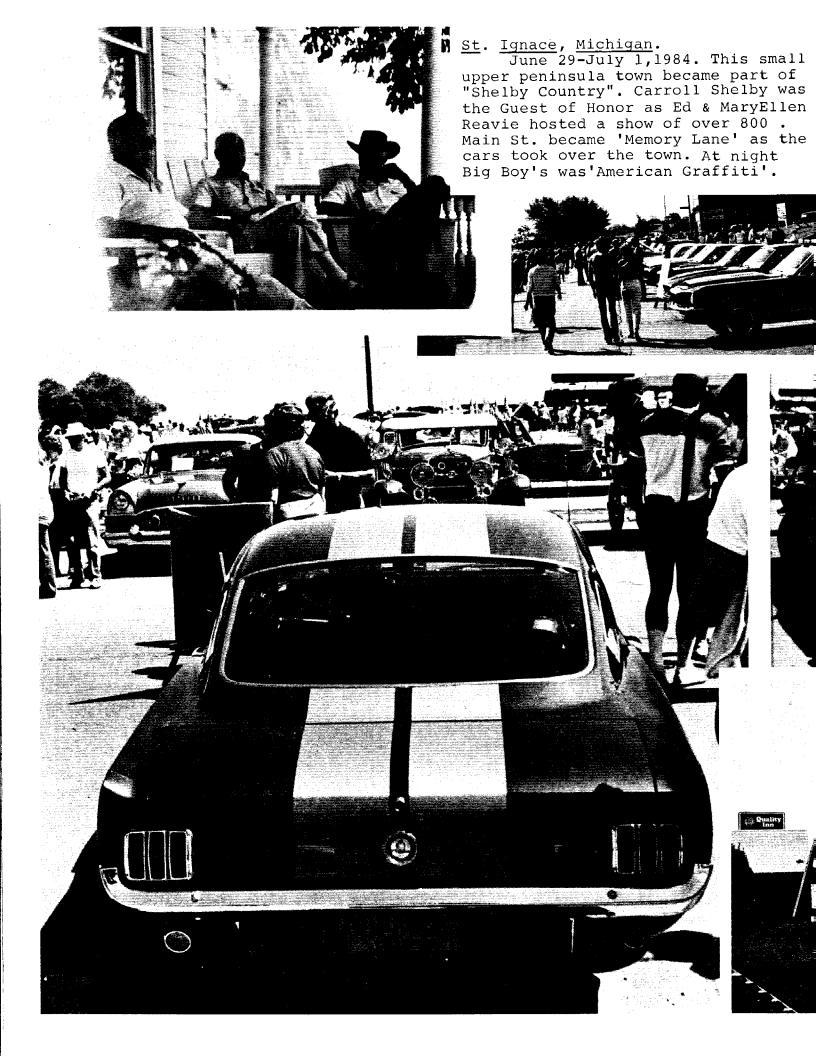
"...from four major road testing magazines, our list is still incomplete. Noticeably missing are the big-block Shelby GT-500's..." so says Donald Farr in the article.

It seems odd that all four of these magazines didn't test any GT 500's. Certainly no oversight like that would occur today. In 1967 the GT 500 was rather tame when compared to the 427 Cobra. Could it be that the cars from Shelby are more famous now than they were when they were new? And if they are why is that?

Is it not true that most works of art and the artists that created them are not appreciated in their own time. Maybe greatness is hard to see close-up.

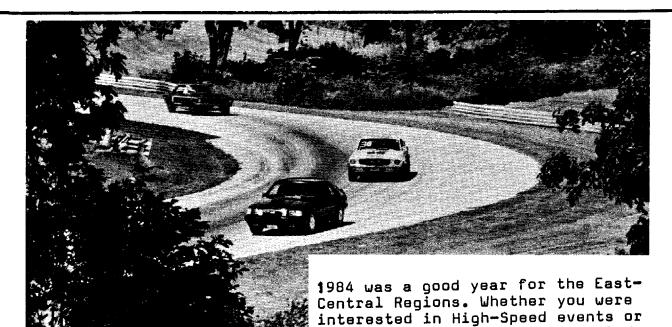


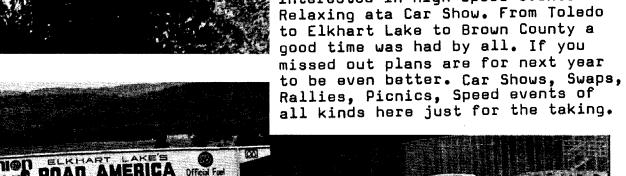








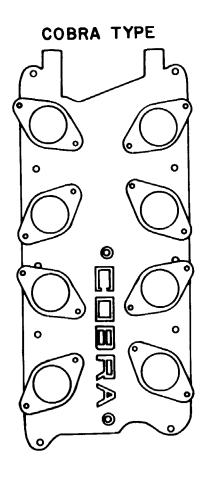


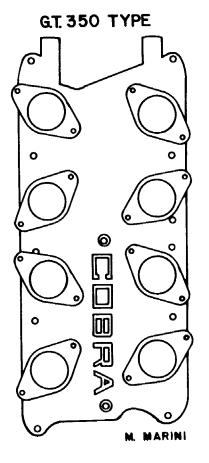




There are many things that you come across when working on Shelby American cars that most people would never recognize if it wasn't pointed out to them. Sometimes it's just a subtle change between years or a design change from necessity. Sometimes you wonder why the change was made at all. Needless to say I've been jotting down all the odd ball things I've spotted and will relay some of the more obvious.

289 Cobra Weber Intake Manifolds. If you ever popped the hood of an early Cobra with Webers, you might have noticed the carburetors faced in opposite directions with fuel lines pointing outward. When the GT350s came out, Shelby came out with an accessory Weber manifold for it. This unit had the carbs facing in the same direction, I assume for linkage purposes. Keep this in mind when picking out a Weber setup for your particular Shelby American car.







TECH TIP - OIL FILTER ADAPTOR

Are there any Tiger owners out there who are disgusted with the "Mickey Mouse" Oil Filter arrangement that came on the beast? Do the oil line connections leak as they did on my car when I bought it 2 ½ years ago? There is an easy solution that I learned from a former Tiger owner and would like to pass on to those of you who are not already aware of it.

You can eliminate the oil leaks and hard, messy job of changing the filter by visiting your local bord Dealer. The oil filter adaptor for a 240 CID Econoline will fit your Tiger with no problem. These are the parts you need:

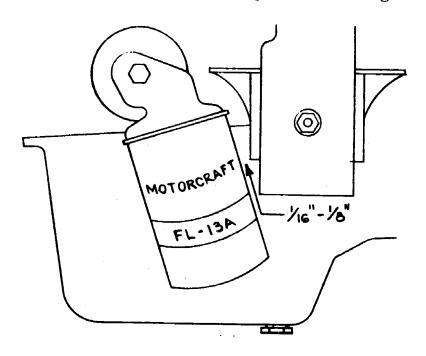
The latest price information I have on these parts (June, 1976) shows a total list price of about \$20.00 (Less whatever discount you can talk your Dealer into).

Remove the existing filter, filter bracket, filter adaptor, hoses and hose adaptor on the block. When you install the new adaptor it should be angled back so that the filter clears the motor mount by approximately 1/16" - 1/8" in order for the filter to clear the oil pan.

Incidentally, you will have to use the smaller filter that fits a Pinto or Capri (Motorcraft FL-13A). Since you won't have as much filter element as before I would recommend a little more frequent oil changes. I hope this is of some help to a Tiger owner somewhere.

Carroll Eeds

will work good with Sanderson (J.C. Whitney) headers but the C.A.T. headers supposedly cause interference. Use an oil filter for a V-6 Capri or Mustang.



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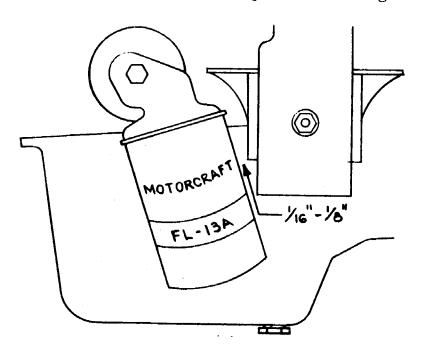
