

Directors Corner

For this issue, I thought I'd give everyone a before the fact review of the article which will be published in an upcoming issue of Ford/Mustang Buyers Guide. We will be receiving 500 copies of said publication to pass out at our Show and Go.

SAAC - MCR

We are the Motor City Regional Chapter of the National Shelby American Automobile Club. Our chapter is located in the Detroit area. You've heard of Detroit, that's where most of the cars come from. Because of our proximity to what is still the car capitol of the world, even in the face of what are indeed some fine cars from the land of the rising sun and der father land, we have attracted some of the most devout car freaks in the world.

Our Regional Club was begun by some very ardent Shelby fanatics. The first Motor City Region Show and Go was held BEFORE the first national Shelby Convention was held. The 12th annual event, which will be held on May 24 and 25. 1987, will be our best event yet - but more on that later.

Our club is still comprised of people who all share a common interest, cars in general, (and Shelby's in particular). Perhaps because of the heritage of the Shelby Automobiles, and I refer to the Shelbys built by ole Shel' hisself from 1962 through 1970 here, most of us in the club are also performance oriented. Each of the club events (except for our mid-Winter swap meet) includes an opportunity to let the cars stretch their leas a bit. We have had several events at a high banked oval track where our perrenial lead foot award winning driver, Phil Jacobs, has been clocked at 147mph. When we say clocked, we mean speed measured on calibrated radar, not measured by an optomistic speedometer. No, he is not a 427 Cobra driver, he has a 1971 Mach 1 with a "nearly" stock Boss 351. There are several club members who have been close to Phil's speeds, but nobody has beaten him - yet. We have had some other very impressive vehicles competing at our events as well. We have had SCCA prepared Panteras, 289 and 427 Cobras and vintage Boss 302 Trans Am race cars, as well as a myriad of fine Shelbys, Bosses and Mustanos.

We have one rule at any of our events. If you have Ford power, you are welcome to participate. Not to sound contradictory, our club motto is "OWNERSHIP IS NOT REQUIRED, ENTHUSIASM IS". We have members who have those funny plastic cars (you gotta have something to drive in the winter).

Go. We have approximately 50 vendors, 200 cars in the show and OYER 2,000 people coming by to agle them and to look for parts. This show has attracted some of the best cars. in the country. Numbered among our participants are Best of Show popular vote winners and first place concours winners from the National Shelby conventions, as well as cars featured in several national magazines. This glowing description is designed to give you the idea that we have a really good annual event. We do. Our club is a whole lot more than one annual event, though. Our club enjoys more of a family atmosphere than that of a club. We have fun all year long. We have an annual winter swap meet as well as a Fall Car Show and swap meet at the Gorno Ford dealership. The owner of which graciously opens his doors to us for these two events. This dealership owner is a SAAC - MCR member who owns a 1970 GT500 convertible.

As I mentioned before, we are more performance oriented than most other clubs and as such we are usually represented at the local drag strips whenever there is a worthy cause. Like last summer, when the Chevelle Club had an invitational meet at the Milan drag strip. Club members Bob Hoeksma and Mike Reimenschnieder went out there with their Shelbys, a Paxton equipped '66 and a nitrous equipped '68 0T500. They made only 23 runs between them and managed to lose not even one of them. This was not easily accomplished, it required all that the cars and the drivers had to offer. The 67500 ran on street tires through the mufflers to the tune of 12.50 at 119mph. The 289 powered '66 turned 12.82 at 110mph. Mike and Bob made believers in Ford blue power out of those guys who have the distributors in the back. The Chevelle club was blue that day, Ford blue!

And now - the commercial for Show and Go XII. The show and swap meet portion will be held May 24, 1987 at the AAA of Michigan corporate headquarters in Dearborn. The cars and trucks will all be in their finest form. Many of the same vendors we have had in the past will also be in attendance. We are in the same place, at the same time, every year. That way we are easy to find, and we see the same faces looking forward to and showing up at our event every year. A few words about our vendors. I have not known of any of our spectators and participants who were disappointed by the quantity or the quality of the parts to be found at our event. Our vendors range from the guy who was just cleaning out his carace and decided to find out if all that old stuff he had was worth anything, to the big reproduction and specialty suppliers and performance shops from many parts of the country. We have the Ford SVO team and some of their cars show up just to remind the people in attendance that performance is alive and well. Thank you, Ford. In our Show, we have a class for everything from Model T to SVO and everything from concours cars to Pro Street and trucks in Each year, we have an outstanding car show called Show and between - as long as it is Ford powered. was a 289Hipo (you remember the little engines that sort of clacked at idle) in an Anglia and an XKE at past shows.


The next day, we gather at the Waterford Hills Road Course a few miles to the north. We have the facility for the entire day, and will be running groups of three or four cars at a time on an individually timed, open track event. I saw the vintage races that were held there for the past two years and have vivid memories of the 289 FIA Cobra running away from the pack, then "crusing" to victory ahead of the Grand Sport Corvette. We are all looking forward to trying out a real race track with our somewhat willing but aging cars.

The safety of the participants and the cars is also a major concern of ours. We will have professional corner workers and emergency medical service at the track. The cars will be spaced out so that they will not be running close to each other. The competition will be there. We hope that you are there to watch it. P.S. General admission is free, as is parking. Enough logistics. The main reason for having this event is to have fun and to let the spectators see the cars in action that they saw sitting the day before.

We have a policy in the club to make the events as reasonably priced as possible. To that end, the entry fees we charge are sufficient to cover only the expenses of putting on the event. Because of the time required to tech each car and to make sure that the people who have plunked down their \$30 have the track time that they deserve, we have limited the number of cars which will be allowed to participate in the open track event to 75. First registered, first allowed in. The club director and the competition director have already reserved positions number 1 and 2. Rank does sometimes have its privledges.

Our club meetings are attended by wives, boy friends, husbands, girl friends (not necessarily in that order) and children, not by a bunch of guys who just sit around and do nothing but bench race. We share information about the cars and solving problems of all types. We also keep up with events and cars for sale. We even go out and look at some of the more interesting cars for sale and bring reports back to the membership. This kind of information is something that you just can't get from magazines. Imagine writing to a magazine and asking them for an opinion before you cash in your life savings and hock the kids to buy the car of your dreams. You can do this at our meetings, as well as getting leads on those hard-to-find parts. We have family outings and parties for the children. We accomplish a lot by cooperating with the other Ford clubs in the area. We pride ourselves in maintaining good relationships so that we may all benefit. If anybody reading this has been a part of running a club before (any club from Cub Scouts to the local Rotary) you know that it is important to maintain interest and good working relationships with EVERYBODY. Our club is all about the people in it and enjoyment of our cars.

Swap and sell was bantered about, for results of parts that were turned up, look to the classifieds section elsewhere in this issue.


A Financial report was given by Lee Swonder, our Treasurer. The books show our coffers filled with \$3,100. (cough-cough!)

Spring Fever (Holley Style)

It hasn't snowed or been below freezing for several weeks now. The three months of road salt has been washed away by the early spring & late winter rain showers. The weather is in the upper fifties and lower sixties for an hour or two each day. The animals and plant life are emerging from their hibernation. But most importantly, a real beast is about to stir from its cave. That beast is your beloved Shelby or Mustang, and the cave is the garage it has been cooped up in to save it from the nasty northern winters.

But when you run out to the garage, heart pounding widly with anticipation, start up your dream machine, it won't idle even to lowly Chevy standards without rattling your insides or stalling. What the *#@! is going on> It ran great last fall when you tucked her in for the long winters nap. Maybe you even went so far as to start the engine and warm it up or even drive it on good days every 2-4 weeks, but the last few

months you succumbed to the winter lazies figuring it would soon be spring and there would be no problem.


Well, if you have a Holley 4-barrel carb (Model 4150 as most Shelby and many hi-po Mustangs came factory equipped or a Model 4150/4160 aftermarket version) that wasn't purchased new, or rebuilt with a Holley kit in the last few years, there is a chance that the metering block to main body gasket has shrunk. You see, Holley had a good idea when originally designing these carbs around the modular concept (seperate fuel bowl system, metering system, etc. in individual castings). This is part of what has made them so popular over the years, since they were easy to work on and modify. However, this has also brought with it some drawbacks. The original carbs manufactured ever since the first 4150/4160 rolled off a vehicle assembly line on a '56 Chrysler used a cork gasket between the metering block and main body. Cork was a favorite gasket material for many engine gaskets for many decades. However when exposed to fuel, then allowed to dry out as the aged fuel evaporates and is not replenished over time (such as by periodically starting the engine) the cork gasket shrinks. When the gasket shrinks, several of the numerous passageways between the metering block and main body can be partially blocked by the gasket. If this happens, the engine idles poorly or not at all, and most likely exhibits stumbles or hesitations on driveways.

Fortunately, Holley recognized this, albeit 20+ years late, and developed new gaskets made of a fibrous material that is coated and is either brown or black in color depending upon the gasket supplier. These gaskets do not shrink, and in fact the coating of the gasket when heat cycled bonds itself to the casting. This can make it a real bear to disassemble and often requires a razor blade to scrape off the "old" gasket when working on the carb after it has been thermo-cycled. But that's a small price to pay for more consistent engine operation. In fact, in some cases the gasket comes off cleanly.


There are a number of other typical carb trouble shooting problems possible such as the fuel bowl screws loosening up and allowing a small air leak at idle (due again to the modular design, thermo-cycling, and probably requires the fuel bowl screws and main body tapped holes to be at the extreme of their tolerance limits) and power valve diaphragm failures (usually only occuring after a severe engine backfire which ruptures the diaphragm material). But in cases where the car ran good when it was put away in storage, the gasket being cork and shrinking as being the problem occurs 9 1/2 times out of 10.

So when rebuilding your Holley carb, make sure your new kit does not use cork gaskets (or buy a Brasswell reinforced rubber style gasket) unless you drive your car almost every day, or still want to rebuild your carb frequently.


