Why Performance Cars Are Staging a Comeback

Carroll Shelby has long been associated with both auto racing and auto design. On the racing circuit he won three national championships and recorded a string of 19 straight victories. Among the milestones was a victory at the famed LeMans race in 1959 and 1956 honors as Sports Illustrated's Sports Car Driver of the Year. With Ford backing, he moved into design in the 1960s with such performance pacesetters as the Cobra and the GT 350 Mustangs. Since 1986, his California firm has been modifying Dodges for Chrysler.



The 1970s, with soaring gasoline prices and government-imposed mileage standards, struck a serious blow to the performance car business. But now, says a noted muscle car pioneer, performance is regaining its old stature.

Design News: How big a factor is performance among today's car buyers?

Shelby: In my view, performance is as big a factor as it was in the 1960s—and maybe even bigger. There are more cars being built now that would fit the description of modern-day muscle cars. We aren't building cars with the big, rumbling, thumping V-8s anymore because of the mileage mandates, but we are still able to achieve a great deal of performance with smaller engines. Every car company in the world of any size has a muscle car—some of them two or three or four.

Q: When did the comeback in performance cars begin?

A: I'd place it at about 1980. At that time, the U.S. car companies were facing very serious problems and they began to realize that a sizeable portion of the buying public is really interested in cars and wants something more than a black box with four wheels to take them from A to B. Since then, the performance segment has been growing and growing.

Q: Some critics have characterized styles of today's cars as boring—

A: No, I don't think so. The designers today are very interested in such factors as aerodynamics, the quality of the ride, and the comfort of the passengers—and

they have been successful in achieving these aims even in cars that are much smaller than models of the '50s and '60s. The cars that are built today, I believe, are vastly superior. Much of this is due to the introduction of more and more electronics. But we have also learned a great deal about suspensions.

Q: How many cars are you modifying each year for Chrysler?

A: Our target is about 3000 cars a year. We aren't in the business to see how large we can get; we are in it to modify small volumes of cars—then help Chrysler move those that are most successful into full-scale production. That's the incentive for Chrysler: they sell us cars at a good price. Then, when we hit a home run, which will likely be the case in one out of every three or four models, Chrysler can move the model into the production line and build 100,000 of them.

Q: Which of your models has been the most successful so far?

A: The one that has created the most publicity and has been gobbled up by the public was the very first one we did—the GLH-S, which is a modified Omni. Only 500 were made, and virtually all of them were sold before they reached the dealers' showrooms. We could have sold 5,000. Among other things, we added special suspension components and a turbocharger that boosted horsepower from 140 to 180. The little thing really goes like hell, which is what people expect from Shelby. Though it sold for only around \$11,000, it'll blow off a 944 Porsche, as

well as a stock 308 Ferrari. I got letters from the Ferrari club disputing this claim, and I wrote an open letter challenging club members to show up at Willow Springs with their cars and check books. I got no takers.

Now, our modified Lancer is a much more sophisticated car, including such things as aerodynamic panels, high-performance shocks and struts, a hopped up 4-cylinder, 2.2ℓ turbo engine, upgraded 4-wheel disc brake system—and a lot of other handling and comfort extras, including a compact disc sound system. Interestingly enough, we found that the automatic transmission was more popular than the 5-speed manual transmission, which tells me that a lot of women are buying them. This car outperforms the 535 BMW. Now I'm not saying it's a superior automobile to the BMW, but it is certainly a worthy competitor when it sells for less than half the money. We call this affordable performance.

Q: What do you consider to be the major ingredients of good performance?

A: I'm for all-around performance rather than being fixated on the 1960s type of performance, which often tended to be straight-line acceleration. Besides good acceleration, you want a car that is a little on the harsh side—but not too harsh—that stops well and takes corners well. For all around driveability, I really enjoy today's smaller performance cars more than the performance cars of the 60s, which really could pin you back to the seat but didn't handle that well.

Q: Do you have plans to introduce V-6 or V-8 engines in your cars?

A: If Chrysler comes out with a small V-8, yes, but I don't intend to go back to the old thumpers. I am planning to move into a four-valve, V-6 as this engine becomes available.

Q: How do American production cars compare in quality and performance to foreign models?

A: For the money, we are ahead of the Europeans, in my mind. And we've pulled up so close to the Japanese that you can hardly tell the difference. The problem is that Americans don't yet appreciate the improvement in U.S. cars. Many fell out of love with American cars 15 years ago when Detroit wasn't building the kinds of cars people wanted. As for the future, it is going to be harder to really identify a car as American or Japanese because of the growing mix of components from all over the world.




