I had a meeting with the PFCA and MOCSEM regarding the International car show. Details: The PFCA is concerned over the affiliation with a moving event and the legal implications, but will be happy to contribute towards participation awards. MOCSEM is concerned with the financial end of things, and has agreed to participate with workers and helping on advertising, but not with money. SAAC-MCR will continue to put on the Waterford event on Friday, May 5, 1989, and all the clubs will heavily advertise the event in their newsletters. bottom line is that MCR is the focus in putting on the event. I've talked with John Manners, they have $% \left\{ 1,2,\ldots ,n\right\} =0$ gotten NO financial backing from any of the previously contacted groups (including FoMoCo) and the cost to those individuals is approx \$12,000 per vehicle. They still have approx 50 cars coming. We will support them in the Motor City area. Plans are not finalized, but there is probably to be a party at the Holiday Inn on Saturday Night.

There is always a time in each club where we must think about money. We haven't had to be overly concerned with this commodity for the past 3-4 years, (how's that for a change for when the Show 'n Go event was financed out of Don Webb and Lee Swonder's private pockets?), but with the advent of paying for our own liability insurance instead of being covered by the National, and being the primary force behind the International Pony Drive, and thinking about upgrading our trailer, we need to carefully consider our resources. We took a \$600 bath on the last jacket order, because of the color problems. As a matter of club policy, we will no longer order major expense items without cash up front from the ordering parties. We will carefully research any item to be ordered before ordering it. We also need to put on a major membership drive, just to ensure that the current members dues are paid up.


