




Autorama Report, by Brian Fedoroff

The 37th annual Autorama was held on February 16, 17, 18, and 19 at the newly expanded Cobo Center in downtown Detroit.Over 700 vehicles of one form or display. another were on Approximately 95,000 people were able to view everything from a manure spreader to a big block chevy powered shopping cart. Ford lovers were treated to a special display in honor of the Mustang's 25th anniversary.

Club participants included four cars in the special 25th anniversary Mustang display: 1968 Shelby GT350 fastblack belonging to Kurt Fredrickson, a gold 1968 Shelby GT500 fastback owned by Jeff Meinicke, a white 1967 Shelby fastback belonging to Bryan Kaltz, and a maroon 1969 Mustang Boss 429 owned by George Huisman. The show organizers decided to put Shelbys in the Mustang display because of the high quality of the cars mentioned above.

Three other cars made up our SAAC-MCR club display: a blue 1970 Mustang Boss 302 road racer belonging to Michael Sedlak, a green 1970 Boss 302 Cougar Eliminator owned by Jeff Finley, and my 1972 Pantera. We certainly had a prime example of the fact that you do not have to own a Shelby (or any car for that matter) to be involved in SAAC-MCR.


Our display also included a continuous showing of video tapes from past club shows and track events. Fliers were passed out to advertise membership in our club, the Gorno Ford swap meet, and the Waterford Hills events that will host the American Pony Drive in May.


Speaking of confusion, one item that was not explained to us by the show organizers was the time at which our cars would be judged. The judges will not judge an area of the car if they do not have access to it. The person next to our club display with his brand X car gave me a lot of pointers as to leaving the hoods and door open overnight so my car could be judged at any time. He showed me how Clear Guard looks better on tires than Armor-All. He also explained how I should make a list of modifications to help the judges with my car. was able to make such a list and left it in my car on Friday night, at which time my car was judged.


A Rick Cole auto auction was held as part of the Autorama on Saturday. A total of 78 cars were put on the auction block, four of which were Shelbys: A white 1968 GT500 KR fastback with auto trans in good condition sold for \$38,500. A blue 1968 GT500 KR fastback with a 4 speed in good condition was a no-sale at \$30,000. A red 1968 GT500 KR fastback with a speed in fair condition sold for \$26,000.Last, but not least, grabber orange 1969 GT500 convertible with auto trans, black top (that did not fit) white interior was no-sale at \$50,000, since the owner had a reserve of \$65,000!



Other activities at the show included a game called post office. All of the people present grabbed a stack of the last club newsletter, fresh from the printer, and applied the mailing labels. This was followed by another game called "Postal sorter, third class", in which all of the labelled newsletters had to be sorted by zip code for bulk mailing.

Sunday evening brought some rewards for our hard work. Jeff Meinicke took second place in the Original Restored '67-'68 category with his gold 1968 GT500 fastback. I was awarded first place in the Foreign Sports category for my '72 pre-L Pantera. Sunday evening also brought more confusion, in spite of our hard work. George Huisman's judging sheet said his car had the wrong hose steering clamps, the wrong wheel, and the wrong tires. Apparently the judges had been judging the wrong car! George ended up in fifth place in the Original Restored category. New member Vito Campanaro was rewarded with first place in the Original Restored category his black '68 GT350 convertible. David Glancy took 2nd place in the Handbuilt Sports category with his red 427 Cobra replica. Also, Randy Betki was rewarded with 2nd place in the Vintage Race category for displaying his Model A speedster. Congradulations!
