



'89 Vintage Races at Waterford Hills

A pleasant tradition has evolved in our little motorsports community here in the metro Detroit area. The tradition I speak of is the annual Vintage races held the first weekend of August at the Waterford Hills Road Race course.


This years event got off to a slow start with the Friday driver school / practice sessions running under storm clouds. It stayed pretty wet most of the day, but managed to clear up in the late afternoon, which allowed for one practice session on a dry track. It also gave some competitors a very long evening to replace a few broken or worn out "vintage" parts.

Saturday's session was by far the most exciting and most well attended. Several local drivers participated in this event, such as Clarence Catallo of Clarkston. Clarence owns the old Can-Am car, dubbed the Sunoco Special, of Roger Penske and Mark Donohue. This is one of those cars that looks so good, that it's hard to believe it was brought to life over 20 years ago.

Another local competitor was Michael Sedlack, who went out for one of Saturday's race sessions sitting on the pole, and stayed there for the win. Michael competed in a Ford Blue 1970 Boss 302 Mustang, an original Trans Am racer of that era.

Additional Ford power was supplied by Ed Ludtke of Farmington Hills, Michigan — with his '65 Shelby Mustang. Ed's car, a road racer most of it's life after leaving the Rouge plant, is a fine example of the turnkey road racers available from Ford / Shelby American in the sixties.

Also competing Saturday was Kurt Fredrickson of Garden City, Kurt runs a 1967 Sunbeam Alpine, formerly campaigned by the team of Bill Pearson and Bob Janoska (in Detroit Region SCCA events) in the late sixites /early seventies. The Sunbeam didn't last long though, a drop in oil pressure caused the little four cylinder to blow a nice big hole in the side of the engine block -- even leaving a few spare parts on the start finish line.


Another region competitor was Robert Varcoe of St. Clair Shores. Bob came into the Waterford event after just taking a First place victory at the Chicago Historic races, held at Road America the weekend before. Bob races a 1967 Camaro Trans Am car. which was formerly raced by Brock Yates of all people. Bob had a very good weekend, finishing first in class in Saturday's race, and two first place overall wins on Sunday.

The familiar red GT350 of Tom Greene was plaqued by a few gremlins during the weekend, but not unlike Ed Ludtke, Tom went home with a trophy. under each arm and enough stories to talk about next year.

Also featured during Saturday's activites were the Volkswagen Media challenge races. Two groups of media types (one group of men, one of women) campaigned in showroom stock prepared Volkswagen GTIs.

Saturday also featured the unveiling of the Kimberly Ferrarri (the honored Marque) that was recently Bennett and all the other hard workers at Restored Memories.

We didn't get to see the car run around the track (they were probably afraid to drive it), but the fit and finish of the old red racer sure shouted out "Quality". Also a feature of Saturday's event was the extremely warm weather. I remember it being my head, and I didn't even feel it melt! workers for their events.



Saturday evening brought on the dinner for the competitors and any one else who wished to attend. The food served was simply wonderful and was most appreciated by those in attendance. The promoters explained that they used a new caterer this year and, judged by the response, will probably use them again at future events. Following dinner, door prizes were raffled off. This was the part of the evening when everyone let their hair down and just plain got rowdy. One of the door prizes given away were cases of motor oil, donated by AGIP - the oil of choice for Ferrari. But even though such a valuable prize awaited the lucky winners, the oil didn't start to move until a group of us started chanting "oil - oil - oil". Myself, I was lucky enough to hold a winning ticket, and yes, I took a case of AGIP oil. Again, everyone had a wonderful time, especially a group of about 40 competitors who came down from Canada to compete in the event.

Sunday was a complete opposite of the day before. The weather dropped down to restored by James Bartell, Bud about 50 degrees around the end of the day. Attendance went way down, due to most of the participants heading over to Meadow Brook for the Concours. This dilema of a race competing directly against the Concours surely can make spending Sunday at the track, a long day. There are still cars out their competing, but their numbers are about half of Saturday's entry. I wish that the race promoters and Meadow Brook could put their heads together and set this event up differently, so the two events are not in direct competition with each other.

I'll close in saying the same thing I've said for the past five years, mark your calendar for the first weekend in August next year, and go out to Waterford and watch these cars run. If spectating isn't your thing, remember, races always need so warm that I placed an ice cube on race workers, and the Waterford Hills organization is always trying to recruit race


So that nobody misses the announcement for the upcoming holiday season happenings, see the next column for opportunities.




FALL GORNO SHOW REPORT
