



The 40th annual Autorama was held on February 14, 15, and 16 at Cobo Hall. This year our club display held eight vehicles instead of the usual twelve, due to changes in the show layout. We were suprised to learn that our scheduled move-in time was 1:00 AM Friday, although it worked out quite well since there was no traffic or lines to contend with. Many of the people with cars in the club display travelled in a convoy, and this really impressed the show officials when we all showed up at the same We were not so impressed, however, when we were asked to leave after only 45 minutes of set-up time! Many club members pitched in to finish the display (some dedicated members were there to help, even though they didn't have a car in our display or in the show) - Dean Ricci frantically vacuumed the rest of the carpeting, while Tom Greene and Dave Allevato helped cut, stretch, and Scott Minch tape the carpeting. really helped make the move-in easier by carrying all of the carpeting, stanchions, and our club sign down to the show, along with his team of assemble who helped helpers, everything.

Our display was pretty well finished when we left in the early hours of Friday, and it turned out to be a very good representation of what the Shelby Club is all about - the enjoyment of a wide variety of Ford powered vehicles. Making up our club display was Scott Minch's '92 "Boss", Kar Kraft; Vito Campanaro's beautifully restored '67 Shelby GT500 Fastback; Dale Rabe's all original '78 Mustang King Cobra; John Logan's '65 Sunbeam Tiger; Oscar Brannan's James Cobra replica; 427 Whiting's '65 Griffith 200; my '72 Pantera; and Carl Galietti's '69 Tom Greene's '66 Mustang Mach I. Shelby GT350 and Kurt Fredrickson's '65 Sunbeam Tiger were pressed into service at the last minute to make up for display separate Meadowbrook Historic races which will be held again this year in August. Walt Berti also had his '70 Mustang Mach I in the show (this car has one

sounding neatest exhaust systems I have ever heard!) Rick Bracken had his '69 Shelby GT500 in MOCSEM display, and Brian Thompson also had his '69 Mustang Mach I in what was to be known as the best display spot in the entire history of the Autorama. In summary, we had one of the most diverse Ford powered car displays ever assembled, which once again helped show that you don't have to own a Shelby (or any car, for that matter) to be active in the Shelby American Automobile Club. Throughout the weekend, approximately 97,000 spectators enjoyed 321 vehicle exhibits competing for awards (along with 30 vehicles not in competition). There were many other attractions "Boom giant such as а competition featuring some vehicles the most outrageous with systems I have ever seen or felt, several celebrity autograph sessions, many commercial displays containing anything from video games to t-shirts to wheels and tires, and the 4th annual Auction Autorama, which was probably the only disappointing Autorama feature of the entire weekend.


I also took a 1st place trophy with my Pantera which was quite special to me since the last time my car was entered (in 1990) it was never judged!



thanks go to Scott Minch and all of the Shelby Club members who pitched in and made this an enjoyable weekend.



















MINUTES OF THE FIRST MEETING OF THE SAAC- MOTOR CITY REGION



Don't Get Screwed!

Here's a tip for anyone running a single plane intake manifold & a Holley carb that may save you some expensive engine parts, time & grief. On earlier build carbs, eight screws were used to attach the throttle body to the main body. Later build carbs, especially the universal aftermarket carbs, deleted the two "center" screws. If all eight screws are utilized with a single plane, open plenum manifold, the center two screws will be left exposed. This leaves the possibility that these two screws could vibrate loose & do some major damage to your engine.

The critical areas for sealing are in the idle circuits which are on the outside of the bores, therefore no loss in performance will be obtained by deletion of those two screws.



CATCH AS CATCH CAN by Steve White

Anyone who has been to a SAAC Open Track Event in the past several years knows that one of the mandatory items is a radiator overflow tank, also known as a catch can, puke tank, etc. This can pose a problem for early Mustangs & Shelbys as they were not factory equipped with such units. Many often hastily Ty-rap an empty pop can to some part of the vehicle & run the overflow hose into it.


But a solution can be had by use of a Vintique, Inc. stainless steel overflow tank. Three different sizes are available. The middle unit is a 20 oz. cylinder of about 2 1/2" diameter by 15" long with integral mounting tabs of stainless steel. A machined aluminum screw in cap w/o-ring seal is incorporated for a high tech effective function. The unit can be purchased from Speedway, Inc. of Lincoln, NE for 42.50 + 8H (p/n 911-02215, ph. 402-474-4411, fax 800-736-3733).

What is so nice about this unit other than its appearance is the fact that the spacing of the mounting brackets on the tank corresponds to the spacing of the early ('64 1/2 - 66) Mustang radiator attching bolts. Thus, with the fabrication of two simple brackets (see sketch) the tank can be attached to the classic Mustang w/o any drilling of holes. This arrangement also places the tanks overflow tube in a position that is clear of any frame members providing a clean discharge if necessary. If you ever want to return to stock, two bolts removal & a few minutes time provides the conversion.

The benefit of a tank, in addition to meeting open track requirements, is in less chance of overheating due to the increased capacity. This benefits your open track experiences as well as in stop & go traffic. This increased capacity comes from being able to run a truely full radiator plus an additional volume in the tank, as oppossed to a radiator with an air space.

One final tip. Read & follow the mounting instructions, as the article in the Spring 1987 Mustang Illustrated Magazine mounted their unit upside down! I've used this unit on my '66 for two years without any problems. This provides a clean & simple solution, with an uncluttered underhood appearance.








Winter Swap Meet Report by Jeff Finley


It was a clear but cold day for the SAAC-MCR 10th Annual Mid-Winter Indoor




